A \$50 deposit will be required to hold your seat, full payment of \$80 prior to the event.

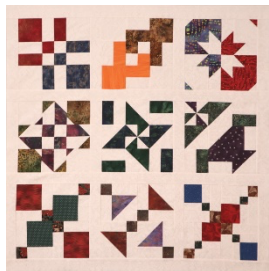
It's going to be a great time with lots of fun and laughter – and hopefully, some sewing.



## Quilters on the Rock General Meeting Minutes

February 16, 2026

**Call to Order:** President Sally Howard called the meeting to order at 6:29pm via Zoom. We had 42 participants including two guests (Susan Rogers and Geri Read) and the presenter Joanne Kerton.

**Program:** Vice-President Piper Bazemore introduced the speaker, Joanne Kerton of Canuck Quilters Design. Her presentation was about how color choices affect the look and feel of a quilt. She emphasized that even with a purchased pattern, you can explore ways in which you can use color to change the way a design looks and make the quilt your own.

Key Points of her presentation include:

### FABRIC SELECTION:

**Value** - The color and value can affect how the quilt looks. To find the value take a picture of your fabric selection and use your phone to see it in black and white and that will show you the values.

**Contrast** - The fabric color choice can affect how your eye sees different things in your quilt. You can take one design and by choosing different values and fabric colors you can

create different quilts. Hint: Be careful to use colors that won't blend with other colors or you won't be able to really see the pattern you are creating.

**Print or Texture** - Solids and prints can be used alone or mixed. Add a splash of color as your “Party Girl” element.  
**Two Fabrics** - Try using only two fabrics – light and dark to make a pattern. You can also use similar colors as the one color.

**BACKGROUND:** Light versus dark. Watch for contrast. Do you want it to blend in or stand out? Dark is not always blue – split the difference and go medium color for the background. What effect are you going for?

**BLOCKS AND SASHING:** Playing with two-color quilts – flip them or flip the sashing and border to get a different look in a quilt.

Swap blocks – Swap blocks and add border. Keep the sashing and change the blocks.

**BORDERS:** If the border is the same as background, then it blends. Flip the values to get a totally different quilt.

Borders Versus No Border - Try using the same color of background for the border versus a specific color for the border, this will make your pattern float.

Use borders as a frame. Try a light border, i.e. go from dark to light.

Multiple borders help ease your eyes when looking at a quilt. The frame can be a thin border, light background to skinny border of darker color and then back to background color for the outside border.

Pieced borders - Scrappy borders can be big scraps of the same width, but different lengths and sewn together. Or plan how long you want your scraps to be. Add a few planned units (flying geese) among the big scraps. Plan inside borders to make the pieced border fit. Stack up borders to build a design.

**BINDING:** If you don't want to take away from how busy your quilt is, maybe the same color binding as your border would be good. Additional binding choices include diagonal stripes, stripes, and scrappy binding.

**BACKING:** Pieced – piece your backing using leftover fabric from the front. Inserting a column to your backing can make up needed width to the back; that way you don't need to buy extra fabric. Build in extra backing fabric so that when you go to quilt, the pieced area doesn't get cut off. Have the column of fabric off center to avoid having to place it exactly in the center.

**Blocks** - Use scraps to make blocks for your back column piece.

**Break:** We took a break at 7:41pm.

Recall to order: We resumed our meeting at 7:56pm.

Happy Birthday: We sang "Happy Birthday" to all February quilters.

**President's Report:** Sally Howard, President reminded the members of the Swap Meet that will on Saturday February 21st from 11 am to 12 noon in the Coupeville Methodist Church parking lot. Please turn in your community quilts and BOMs, pick up batting, kits and/or labels.

Sally Howard read part of two thank-you notes:

Gift's from the Heart Food Bank in Coupeville sent a letter in January 2026 acknowledging a donation of \$170 made last March 2025 and included their tax id# and a letter from Quilt Museum, thanking us for the \$2000 donation for their boiler.

**Secretary Report:** Ingrid Schwalbe, Secretary explained that she had two corrections to the January minutes and asked for a motion to approve the minutes. Mary Stewart made a motion and Leone Wilson seconded. The motion Passed.

**Treasurer Report:** Sally Wolff, Treasurer reported the following:

**Vice President/Programs Report:** Piper Bazemore, Vice-President reported that March's presenter will be Brita Nelson, who will be showing us the magic and beauty of disappearing blocks. Piper said that there are three spots still available for Brita's workshop. She said the information is in the February Newsletter or you can email her. The cost is \$65 per person. She asked if you write a check, to please write on the Memo line that it is for the March Workshop.

For the April in person meeting, Piper reported that Marcia Derse will be talking about her new fabric collection that just came out in February 2026. Marica is a fiber artist and fabric designer located on Whidbey Island. She will talk about how she designs her fabric and her process. She will also have fabric for sale during the meeting.

**Membership Committee:** Kim Martin thanked everyone who had paid their dues. She asked that if you haven't yet paid your dues, then she will be at the swap meet with the Square and will give out membership cards to those that pay. The deadline for paying is at the end of March.

Those who haven't paid dues will be taken off the roster. Regarding Honorary members, Kim asked that if you know anyone who is turning 80 to please let her know.

**Community Quilts:** Linda Nienhuis reported that they had a fabulous Play Day on Saturday, February 7th. 6 medium and 11 large packs were created. 8 members were in attendance. Fun was had by all, including Brownies. The next Play Day will be announced in the future.

Linda will be at the Swap Meet on Saturday, February 21st to hand out supplies and take in quilts. Email her if you need anything.

Linda suggested that it might be good idea to have a Play Day to piece together batting.

Linda reported that the MAC unit received 8 quilts and that Hospital Gift Shop is closed for the month. No Budget for Baby quilts were turned in.

Linda asked for fabric donations of browns, greens, grey and blackish, as well as batting.

**American Hero Quilts:** Marilyn Egler reported that the handover has not happened yet, but she and Linda Nienhuis will get with Carolyn Lokkins as soon as possible.

**Meals on Wheels Placemats and WAIF Beds:** Nancy Nielsen said she will bring a box of scraps to the next in-person meeting so that people might be able to use them to make placemats. Sally Howard asked Nancy if she could use a supply of pieced batting for the placemats, however Nancy said she had no room to store them and said that most people use their own batting. Another member asked if ovals in the design are okay and Nancy replied that they were.

**Sunshine Club:** Vickie Matzen asked members to email her if anyone knows of someone who could use a card to cheer them up. A member asked Vickie if she would send

a card to Vicki Chambers and Barb Moen and Vickie agreed.

Fabric Sale: Sally Wolff reported that the Connecting Threads Catalog is having a \$5, \$7, \$9 dollar a yard sale through the 19th of February.

**UFO Challenge:** Kim Martin reported that a total of 447 projects have been submitted and 64 projects already checked off the list. This month’s project is number 11. Kim suggested to just do your binding to get it done!

**Block of the Month:** Debbie Koehnen presented March’s block: The Flying Goose Block. Use Slate blue, greys, charcoals, and ivory to complete your blocks. The inspiration for this month’s block is the children’s book Mother Bruce by Ryan T. Higgins. She suggested that you play with switching the colors around on the blocks to create different blocks. It will be a 9” finished block. Debbie took us through how to put the block together showing three different ways.

**2026 Quilt Challenge:** Diane Mannie reminded us to dust off that pattern! Diane showed us a block that she made from a pattern she has had for a long time. She said to “Keep working on it!” and to bring what you have completed so far to the in-person meeting to show people and to get them excited about completing their own.

**Show and Tell:** Dorothy Waite presented the Show and Tell PowerPoint – 6 members shared a variety of quilts: Diane Perin, Linda Nienhuis, Joline DeVos, Sally Howard, Diane Mannie, Sally Wolff.

**Parade Report:** Lynn Scoby mentioned the America 250 celebration this year and the possibility of QOR marching in the Coupeville Memorial Day Parade. She said she will forward information to Sally Howard.

# QOR Mar 2026 BOM – Flying Geese

## QOR March 2026 BOM – Flying Geese

**Mother Bruce** by Ryan T Higgins, + many more

Finished block = 9 Unfinished = 9 ½"

**Fabrics:** ivory, slate or grayed blues, grays

**Cut:** grays & blues can be used as geese or side bars

Sidebar- two 2" x 9 ½" rectangles

3 flying geese components, finished to 3" x 6"



### Method 1: triangle rulers

Cut 3 ½" strips, then use triangle rulers to cut 1 large goose triangle of blue or gray & 2 ivory corner triangles for each flying geese component. You need 3 total

### Method 2: stitch & flip

Cut three 3 ½ X 6 ½" rectangles of blue or gray

Cut six 3 ½" squares of ivory

Place squares in corner of rectangle. Draw & sew on diagonal line, trim excess ¼" away from seam, press toward ivory & repeat for 2<sup>nd</sup> corner



### Method 3: 4-at-a-time

Cut a 7 ¼" square of blue or gray – it will make 4 geese components

Cut four 3 7/8" squares of ivory

Place 2 ivory squares in opposite corners of dark square, draw diagonal line, sew on both sides ¼" away from line. Cut apart on diagonal line & press away from darker rectangle

Lay another square in the open corner, draw diagonal line from corner to center of rectangle, sew on both sides of line, cut apart on line, & press. Repeat with last piece.

Sew flying geese of top of each other in a column, then add a bar to each side

## Quilt Sizes for our Community Quilt Projects (eff. 12/2023)

### Whidbey Health Medical Ambulatory Clinic (MAC)

- 45" x 60"
- 32" x 40" (if receiving treatment in wheel chair)
- Male and female themes - young adult to senior themes

### Whidbey Hospital Gift Shop

Baby themed fabric and use the small QOR sew in label.

- 24" x 24" for the car seat quilt
- Min. 24" x 36" to max. 40" x 50" for quilts for babies to lay on

### Opportunity Council, Island County

- Offered to children, families, veterans in crisis, transition
- 45" x 60" Lap
- 70" x 90" Twin - most requested
- And all sizes in between
- Adult and juvenile themes

### Navy Marine Corps Relief Society Budget for Baby

- Width 30"-32" to Length 30"-32" (Size must be precise)
- Baby themes
- Sewn-on label only (not the "in the binding" style)

### Annual Military Gratitude Event

- Does not need to be patriotic
- All sizes accepted
- Adult and juvenile themes

### American Hero Quilts (AHQ)

- Quilts are sized for hospital beds of wounded military members
- No metallic fabric, no sparkles, no flannel, no corduroy, no fleece
- 63" x 87"

### Placemats - Island County Senior Services Meals on Wheels (MOW)

- Dimensions: 12"-14" top to bottom and 18"-20" wide

### WAIF Animal Shelter -

- Cat beds: 12" x 18" - Blanket, or pillow stuffed with fabric and batting scraps
- Dog beds: 24" x 36" - Blanket made of flannel or fleece or towels (no more stuffed beds for dogs)

### **NOTES:**

To ensure the long life of these quilts which may be handled and washed often, please give them a final quality control check:

- Pieced Seams – All seams joined completely with no gaps?
  - Binding – Completely catching/covering raw edges and sturdily sewn on? Each seam backstitched?
  - Quilting – Quilting lines are 2" to 4" apart with secure start and stop points?
  - Label – Sewn into the binding seam or securely sewn on all 4 sides?
